SEED Scholarship Program

We began and ended the year with our 19 scholars receiving the full scholarship for high school education in Ikorodu, Lagos Nigeria. Although a few of them were slightly lagging in their academic qualification for recertification of their scholarship status, we decided to give them another chance to remedy their failing grades. Details about the program structure are in the program guide available on our website.

One notable mention is the case of one of the scholars who was among those on the verge of being dropped from the program. This scholar spent a chunk of time in the hospital during the first term of the academic session and this absenteeism caused his grade to drop significantly. Thankfully, one of our SEED Scholarship sponsors came to his rescue and offered to sponsor this child in addition to a current sponsorship for another child. In the words of the sponsor "this child deserves another chance as it was not his fault that he was in the hospital and couldn't attend class". We are grateful to this sponsor for her kind gesture and love to this child.

This is the breakdown of class category for the 19 scholars in this program at the end of the year 2019:

- Junior Secondary School Class 1: 0
- Junior Secondary School Class 2: 7
- Junior Secondary School Class 3: 7
- Senior Secondary School Class 1: 0
- Senior Secondary School Class 2: 2
- Senior Secondary School Class 3: 3

Annual Awards: Every year the SEED Scholarship program honors students with high academic performance with award recognition and a cash prize. For each academic term, we honor one student with the most number of A grades and for the entire academic session we honor one student with the most number of A grades in the year.

The award ceremony was held during the annual SEED Scholarship stakeholders meeting on September 6, 2019 at Ikorodu, Lagos Nigeria.

 - Third term: He had 10 "A" grades out of 14 subjects; he had "B" grades in the remaining 4 subjects.
 - Miracle FRANK had a total of 29 "A" grades through the 2018/2019 academic session.
